Message from the Manse

In the week of Christian Unity it was a privilege for us to join with congregations from Balerno and Juniper Green. The Moderator, Right Rev Dr Colin Sinclair and his lovely wife Ruth offered wisdom, warmth and kindness. In his sermon, Colin took us back to the basics of Christian life: What does it mean to follow Jesus?

These day days when we mention following, we think of snapchat, newsfeed, twitter, Facebook. We follow our football teams, the Rugby leagues. In these instances, being a follower only means we are observers, people on the side-lines. We may be supporters or detractors. We are actively watching but not taking part.

These things can bring us ups and downs. WE can enjoy the experience of people liking a post or if our team wins. On the other hand, no one wants to watch their team lose and we know that young people are affected when negative posts hurt them on social media.

Colin Sinclair re-invigorated, restored and re-energised the ideals of Christian life when he explained that to be a follower of Jesus is not to be a spectator or observer. We get to be involved and to follow Jesus means we have to step up and do our bit to take part.

We don't need to worry about what the best or worst of humanity thinks of us. We have a role to play to make the world a more compassionate place in God's eyes.

As Jesus taught, following him means to serve people and the world . . . as part of the family of God . . . to offer serious love and kindness to people we encounter, some whom we know and others whom we entrust to God's care though we might not know them.

Following Jesus takes us on a journey beyond ourselves and our immediate understanding of things into a dimension that is eternal.

Ultimately following Jesus is not some lonely job. We are in this together and we cannot do it without the help of Jesus who sent his Holy Spirit to help us. As we approach Lent and the season of Easter, I look

forward to going on the journey following Jesus with you and I hope we may all grow together as we do.

“A70 Have Your Say” public meeting—Gibson Craig Halls—24 February



The first public meeting to discuss what we can do about local traffic, parking and congestion will be on Monday 24 February at 8pm in the Gibson Craig Halls.

For the past few months students from Heriot-Watt University have been holding informal group discussions in the three villages to discover what local traffic issues need the most urgent attention. Professor Guy Walker and his students will deliver their initial report, and reveal some ideas before asking which they should investigate further.

Along the A70 we have inherited a road system that evolved from lanes serving local villages and farms a century ago. The latest draft of

the ‘City Plan 2030’ only promises more local development and the promise of even more commuters, cars and congestion.

“We’d been told about some specific issues, from improving public transport connectivity to dealing with rat-running and on street parking when we began the study. These certainly exist, but we found a much more complicated picture” explained Engineering student Mark Smith, “Just getting to the shops is becoming more and more difficult for many. So please come along to hear what we’ve discovered and voice your opinion”

Over the next months the students will investigate, study and test the best ideas chosen by the meeting, which is the first of several planned by our three local Community Councils and Heriot-Watt.

A Huge Thank You to all Our Supporters!

Because of your outstanding generosity and support, we raised over £100k for the Bethany Care Shelter, enough for 4,750 bed spaces! You have also donated an additional £12k in Gift Aid which has provided a further 570 bed spaces.

This huge sum raised will contribute significantly to our funding of the Bethany Care Shelter. We never imagined the immense response we would receive from press coverage and social media shares. Together we've provided life-saving shelter and care for people who would otherwise have been forced to sleep outside this winter.

On Christmas Day, one of our volunteers was up at 5:30 am to make bacon rolls for everyone who had spent the night at the Care Shelter and a last minute donation of presents meant everyone was able to open a gift in the morning.

Christmas is a particularly hard time for those who are homeless. We hope the Care Shelter - and the knowledge that there is support from kind people like you—has provided relief for those that are without family, home and community this winter. Rough sleeping is just one but very visible aspect of the complex issue of homelessness. We work not just to meet people at the point of crisis, but we also seek to prevent people from becoming homeless in the first place.

Your future support remains vital in this mission to end homelessness in Scotland.

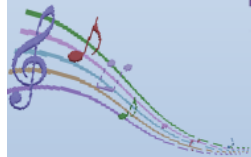
