A Letter from Easter

Dear Friends,

As we approach Passiontide and re-experience Christ's journey from Palm Sunday through Holy Week to Easter Day, I am reminded that the life of faith is full of ups and downs, and that people can be fickle.

In that fateful, decisive week, the crowds who applauded and cheered when Jesus entered Jerusalem were persuaded to turn their shouts of 'Hosanna, Blessed is He!' to cries of 'Crucify Him!'.

As you journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and the Cross, it is important not to forget that Jesus took that journey knowing there was a higher purpose and a heavenly plan, and so He endured betrayal, persecution, affliction, and even death!

The world faces wars, economic downturns, storms and hardships, but we must keep our faith and pray, holding fast to the depth of God's covenant with us, and his love for us which is declared once again, through this, my favourite season in the Christian Year.

alley Friends is a community befriending project run by St Mungo's Episcopal Church, Balerno. The project is designed to reach isolated older people living in Balerno, Currie and Juniper Green who are experiencing loneliness and bring hope and connection to them.

Community Befriending Project

The project is aimed at people who are aged 65 and over living in the postcode areas of EH14, 5, 6 or 7, and who are at risk of social isolation due to poor health, living alone or at a distance from family and friends. People can be referred by social workers, GPs and community agencies, friends and family members, or refer themselves. Upon assessment, people are matched to the most appropriate volunteer. We aim to make the best match to enable a relationship of friendship and trust to grow.

Our volunteers: We recruit befrienders from across the community who have a genuine interest and desire to make a difference in the lives of the people that we seek to serve.

All our befrienders undergo a selection process including an interview, training, and references, and are members of the PVG scheme for working with vulnerable adults.

Easter in a Box - The Movie!

his term we welcomed the P5 and P7 classes from Nether Currie Primary to take part in a workshop exploring the Christian Easter story. We used a resource called Easter in a Box—the Movie. The premise for this is we invite the children to imagine they are on a movie set, watching the filming of "Easter—the Movie". The plot of the movie is revealed as we unpack six boxes together.

Each box contains a cast list, a set map, and props from a scene in the movie. For each box we pass round the props and wonder about their meaning; listen to or act out the script from the scene; track emotions; pause to reflect and respond; consolidate learning with a fun activity; and collect items in their very own takeaway mini-Easter-in-a-Box. All the children seemed to enjoy the workshop





and fully entered into every aspect of the programme. We had a wonderful time exploring the story with the pupils and want to thank them and the members of staff for joining us and brightening up our Wednesday mornings! We look forward to welcoming the whole school to Currie Kirk for their Easter assembly on Friday 31 March. Thanks too to Fiona, June and Catherine who helped to run the workshop, it couldn't have happened without them.

Presbytery Plan Update

In the December-January issue of Kirk News we informed everyone that Currie Kirk had agreed to form a Deferred Union with Balerno Parish Church in the Presbytery Plan as all churches were being discouraged from our preferred option of Linkage. We were informed that a Deferred Union means that when one of our ministers moves on, a vacancy committee from both churches calls a new minister to that church. Only when the other minster moves on do the churches unite under the existing minister, who, of course, was called by both churches.

The Presbytery Plan was due to be signed off on 7 February 2023 when it was anticipated that advice and guidance would be forthcoming from Presbytery on how we would be expected to work together on implementing the Plan.

However, Presbytery had to cancel the sign-off on 7 February as there was a problem with one particular area of the City unable to give its agreement to what is to happen to church properties in its Mission District; consent from all Districts is essential before the Plan can be signed off. We received no advice or guidance meantime.

Rev Dr Stewart Weaver, Convener of the Deployment Group, has now written to all Presbytery churches stating that although conversations are still ongoing with those in dispute above, the hope is for the Presbytery Plan to be tabled for signoff on 25 April 2023. The Presbytery Mission Plan Implementation Group would approve the Presbytery Mission Plan of Edinburgh and West Lothian subject to the following conditions:

by the date of first annual review, the Presbytery will set out, in as much detail as possible, when and how it proposes to effect the unions of (i) Balerno and Currie; (ii) Canongate and High St Giles; (iii) Greyfriars and St Cuthbert's; and, (iv) St Andrews' & St George's West and the united charges of Broughton St Mary's and Greenside;

Dr Weaver has informed us that "over the course of the next year, it will be important for the Deployment Group to work with congregations" in a Deferred Union to provide information on how we will form the actual union—which seems to differ from the advice we were given in paragraph one above.

We will keep you updated on what seems to be an increasingly complex process.
