oday is November 18<sup>th</sup> and shortly I'll be meeting people to plan their child's baptism. One day soon, a young life will be enfolded

publicly in the life-giving story of Jesus. Jesus who was born, died and raised up for us: Come Christmas we will celebrate the birth of Jesus, the "most precious Word of Life", "God with Us".

The Christening is set to take place on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> of November in Balerno Parish Church. That Sunday is the festival of the Reign of Christ, the last Sunday of the Christian year before we turn once more to Advent, a season of preparation, anticipation and delayed celebration. For us in the northern hemisphere, this takes place as the days shorten, the nights lengthen and the cold and dark are with us. When the dark is deepest, we will mark the birth of the Light of the World.

When we are puzzled, perplexed or seeking guidance, we might say something such as: "I am in the dark, enlighten me". Any of us may be 'in the dark' at some point or other. So may churches, communities, peoples. The Bible itself begins with everything in a state of chaos and darkness, as the Spirit of God broods over it bringing divine order. In due course God says, "Let there be light".

"Let there be light". Advent is the time of waiting for the light. The time set aside for us to train ourselves in the radical discipline of patience. To await the coming of the "Let there be light" moment.

In God Welcomes All\*, there is an Advent hymn by Brian Wren:

"Joyful is the dark, holy, hidden God, rolling cloud of night beyond all naming: Majesty in darkness, Energy in love, Word-in-flesh, the mystery proclaiming."

As People of the Way, we travel roads that take us through darkness and light, sunset and sunrise. There will be moments of waiting in the dark, just as there will also be "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing" moments. Each in due time.

I hope that through the Advent season, the waiting time, we might rediscover depth and sustenance in our Advent faith:

or, as this prayer says:

You keep us waiting.
You, the God of all time,

who will be with us, and what we must
do.

So thank you ... for the waiting time.\*\*

Isn't Advent the cradle, in which the Christmas celebration, when it comes, makes deepest sense?

Sing! Sing all earth!
Sing! Sing all earth! Eternal praises
sing,
To our Redeemer,
To our Redeemer and our heavenly
King!
Shepherds arise, be not afraid;
With hasty steps repair
To David's city: see the maid
With her blest Infant there.

ur coffee morning on 25 October was a great success and thanks to all for the hard work and to those who attended; enjoyed the baking; the fun at the tombola; and those who picked up their holiday reading. The grand sum of £687.86 was raised for our project this year "Crossreach".

The speaker from the Holyrood Ranger Service on the 7 October spoke about the different plants in the Park and the problems with wild fires. Also rock falls meaning the road at Salisbury Crags was closed at the moment for public safety.

We were joined by John Knox from Bridgend Farm who told us about the amazing achievement of the local community securing a community purchase of the derelict farm and the work they do in supporting people within their community. From young people struggling to engage with school to providing skill workshops for others working in the cafe and many others including work in the allotments.

Our speaker on Scots Women Who Chose to Challenge gave an interesting insight into the lives of many Scots Women, ahead of their time. Elsie Inglis being one and who many of us were well aware of having spent time in her maternity hospital—sadly no longer in existence. We also heard about Bruntsfield born Muriel Spark best known for writing "The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie".

Our most recent talk was from George Anderson of the Beechgrove Garden who spoke on Nature Closely Observed. His talk with beautiful slides was wonderful. He showed us how plants are formed and showed us examples of how they are mirrored in Art and Architecture.

We look forward to our meeting on the 2 December with the Rev Sheena Orr who will be speaking on The Scottish Prison Service.

On the 16 December at 1 pm we will be having our Christmas Party followed by a musical rendition from the Kirk Singers—a very pleasant afternoon is guaranteed.

The second half of our session begins on 20 January at 2 pm when Irene Malcolm will be our speaker—her theme of "Knitted Gospels" sounds intriguing.

He was ordained as an Elder in October 1989 and presented with a long service certificate in December 2019. He was a conscientious and diligent District Elder, a one time member of the Congregational Board and for many years undertook the important position

of a Safeguarding Officer, a post of ever increasing complexity as legislation evolved. Sandy was also a leading light in the Kirk Singers.

In the words of the 4th Chapter of 2 Timothy as recorded in the New Testament "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith". That was Sandy Harper.
