Letter from Anne (our Interim Moderator):

Dear Friends,

How must it have felt for the women as they approached the tomb on Easter morning? Think of all they had been through. The hosannas of the Palm Procession when Jesus entered Jerusalem; the fear when they heard of his arrest and trial; the clamour of crowds shouting 'Crucify Him;' then the utter despair as they watched hope die on a cross. What thoughts went through their heads? How must it have seemed to them when they were told "Do not be alarmed, you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here Go and say to his disciples and to Peter 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee ...'" And so it was, Jesus had gone ahead of them.

It is one of the great messages of Easter, that no matter where we travel, Jesus has gone ahead of us. No matter what we face as individuals or as a congregation, uncertainty, change, illness, despair, pain or death—Jesus has gone ahead of us. No matter what we plan or hope for, no matter what visions or bold adventures we dream of—Jesus has gone before us. So often, we look for Jesus in the past, we come to anoint the body of dead Lord, but Jesus has gone before us into the new, into the future.

Let us rejoice that we worship a living Saviour.

We wish you all a happy, lively Easter.


Shoebox Appeal—A new way to donate!

Valley Friends Befriending Project – January 2024 News

"Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" Hebrews 10 v 24

We contacted your church in the spring of 2023 to tell you about the St Mungo's befriending project "Valley Friends". You may have also seen articles about the project in the C and B news and Konect magazine, and also adverts on several local Facebook groups.

Loneliness is a huge issue with growing numbers of people living longer, but becoming increasingly isolated, in a fragmented society that places greater value on the young. We know that the need, though often hidden, is deep. At the start of the project the pace of referrals coming in was slow. However, in the past year, links and awareness within G.P practices and the social work department have grown and the tide is turning with the number of referrals that we are receiving, steadily increasing. So far we have not needed to operate a waiting list but this may soon have to change.

We would like to ask for your help. Would you have the heart to give an hour a week or a fortnight to offer friendship to a person who feels alone? Training is provided and we provide the opportunity to network with the other befrienders and grow further connection across our communities. It has always been our hope that Valley Friends would also be a bridge between our community and our churches, a tangible outworking of God's love in action. An initiative that we could work on together.

Transport Fund


re you a previous user of the minibus? Do you have difficulty getting to church due to mobility issues or lack of transport? Then the transport fund is for you.

When the minibus was sold and the charity wound up, a great deal of money was released part of which was given to Currie Kirk to set up a Transport Fund. Had the minibus not been sold, these monies would have been used for the upkeep of the bus—tax, insurance, MOT, petrol

etc. These would have cost considerably more than paying for taxis to and from church. Please make use of the fund. The money is there to assist you. All that is required is a receipt from the driver which you can hand to any elder on duty and the money will be refunded to you. For journeys home from church just bring the receipt the following week or whenever you are next in church. You can also use it if you have difficulty getting to and from the Guild. Again just obtain a receipt and hand it to a committee member. Church postcode is EH14 6AL.

Presbytery Plan—The Union of Currie Kirk and Balerno Parish Church

It must seem, at times, as though very little is happening to progress the Union between Currie and Balerno as set out in the Presbytery Plan. In fact, there has been a great deal of discussion and a great deal of thinking happening in the background. Filling in the detail of the Basis and Plan of Union is often the easy thing, actually creating a united congregation is more difficult and takes time, effort and goodwill. However, progress is being made and it is likely that in the early summer, the Kirk Sessions will be able to vote on the Basis of Union. If the two Kirk Session votes are favourable, then Presbytery will hold congregational votes shortly after. The Presbytery have given permission for the sale of the Currie Manse, but we are currently in negotiation with the General Trustees of the Church of Scotland, about how the proceeds may be used. We acknowledge the contribution made to the steering group by the late Marion Milne and also by Bill Black, who recently resigned as the chairperson.
